A checklist of Emperors and others Associated with Roman Britain

JULIUS CAESAR (Dictator 43 BC) raided southern Britain in 55 BC and 54 BC.

MARK ANTHONY issued as series of *denarii* featuring different legions, including ones which later served in Britain – II *Augusta*, VI *Victrix*, IX *Hispana*, XIV *Gemina*, XX *Valeria*.

CLAUDIUS (Emperor 41 - 54 AD) initiated the conquest of Britain in 43 AD and himself came to Britain (with a squadron of elephants) to receive the 'surrender' of the Britons, taking the title *de Britannia* on behalf of his young son.

VESPASIAN (Emperor 69 - 79 AD) commanded the Second Legion in the Claudian invasion and, as Emperor, initiated the conquest of northern Britain.

TRAJAN (Emperor 98 - 117) abandoned the attempt to conquer the whole of Britain and ordered the building of legionary forts at Chester, York and Caerleon.

HADRIAN (Emperor 117 – 138) visited Britain in 122 AD and built a Wall.

ANTONINUS PIUS (Emperor 138 - 161) ordered the re-occupation of southern Scotland and the building of the wall that bears his name.

PERTINAX (Emperor 193) had been Governor of Britain in 187 AD.

CLODIUS ALBINUS (Emperor 195 - 197) proclaimed Emperor while Governor of Britain and withdrew troops from Britain in his bid for power, leaving the country open to invasion.

SEPTIMUS SEVERUS (Emperor 193 - 211) campaigned in Britain, rebuilt Hadrian's Wall attempted to conquer Caledonia (modern Scotland) and divided Britain into two provinces before dying at York.

CARACALLA (Emperor 198 - 217) and **GETA** (Emperor 209 - 212) campaigned in Britain with their father Septimus Severus in 209-210 AD.

CARAUSIUS (Usurper 289 – 293) was commander of the Channel Fleet and occupied Britain and Gaul in his bid for power. He built the 'Forts of the Saxon Shore' in S.E. Britain.

ALECTUS (Usurper 293 – 296) murdered Carausius and ruled in Britain and Gaul.

CONSTANTIUS I (Caesar 293 - 295 and Emperor 305 - 306) invaded Britain and defeated Alectus in 296. Campaigned in Britain in 306 to restore order in the north and died at York.

CONSTANTINE I *the Great* (Emperor 307 – 337) campaigned in Britain with his father and was proclaimed Emperor at York following his father's death. Later, he reunited the East and West Empires and made Christianity the official religion.

CONSTANS (Emperor 337 - 350) visited Britain in the winter of 342, the last ruling Emperor to visit the Province.

MAGNUS MAXIMUS (Usurper 383 - 388) was Governor of Britain. He removed troops from Britain in his bid for power, leaving the island undefended.

CONSTANTINE III (Usurper 407 - 411) was proclaimed 'Emperor' in Britain – though only a common soldier, his name was right!

HONORIUS (Emperor 393 – 423) removed most of the British garrison in 407 to defend Rome from barbarian attack; three years later he wrote to the British cities telling them to arrange their own defence – Britain had ceased to be a Province of the Roman Empire.
